Palmetto's 2016-17 basketball season came to a close with last Thursday evening's Senior Night games against Powdersville.

The Mustang boys ended a rather frustrating season on a positive note, as they defeated the visiting Patriots, 55-49.

Coach Will Clarke's team had developed a reputation for leading most of its opponents for the better part of each game, only to see a costly fourth-quarter collapse lead to a disappointing setback.

That didn't happen in the Mustangs last game of the season, as they once again led most of the way, but also managed to finish just as strong, in topping the visiting Patriots, 55-49.

They got out to a 15-10 advantage after one quarter, held a 24-22 edge at the break, and increased their lead to 39-33 going into the fourth quarter, where they matched Powdersville point-for-point, 16-16, to get the hard-earned win.

Hunter Gowan lit up the scoreboard with 16 points, while Ben Cothran, Hunter Donald, and Tay Thomason each added eight more points to the winning tally for Palmetto.

The Lady Mustangs came within possibly just one win of qualifying for the State 3-A Playoffs, as they finished 3-7 in Region II-AAA after dropping Thursday evening's game to Powdersville, 50-39.

Sarah Parris fired in 14 points, Gracie Williams tallied 10 more, and Savannah Fields added another nine to lead the Lady Mustangs.

Area athletes on All-State teams

Seven of our standout football players were recently recognized on The High School Sports Report's All-State Team.

Wren QB Jay Ulrich was named to the Statewide All-State Offensive Team.

Ulrich, who will play his collegiate football at the University of South Carolina, threw for 2,055 yards and ran for another 4,036, while accounting for 35 touch-

downs. Palmetto QB Shaw Crocker, WR Payton Young, and LB Bryce Berry were chosen for the All-State AAA Team.

Crocker, who will be playing collegiately for Wingate University, threw for a school-record 3,209 yards and 35 touchdowns.

Young, who will be playing collegiate baseball for reigning NCAA Champion Coastal Carolina,

caught passes for 978 yards and 13 touchdowns.

Berry, who will be returning for his senior year with the Mustangs, was one of the team's leading tacklers.

Powdersville RB EJ Humphrey and DB Gavin Agin were also honored on the All-State AAA Team.

Humphrey had 1,515 yards rushing and 260 more receiving yards, to go along with 29 touch-

downs. Agin picked off nine passes to lead the defensive effort for the Patriots.

Woodmont Davonne Bowen was picked for the All-State AAAA Team.

He was a dominant player on defense, while also proving to be a threat as a kick returner. He will be taking his skills to the University of South Carolina.

Powdersville Girls make 3-A Playoffs

The Powdersville girls had 'made it our norm' to make the state basketball playoffs during their early seasons of play in Class 2-A.

And now, they're doing the same thing in Class 3-A, as they finished their first regular season of play in the

'higher' classification as the third-place team in Region II-AAA, and thus earned their first-ever berth in the State 3-A Playoffs.

(The Lady Patriots opened the state tournament on Monday at Region I-AAA Runner-Up Pendleton, in hopes

of reaching second-round action on Thursday.)

Coach Pam Prescott's squad had been within one game of first-place in the region standings before losing three-straight games and dropping down to the third spot.

A loss at Palmetto on Thursday would have dealt the local ladies an even harder blow and left them as the region's fourth-place playoff entry.

But things took a much-needed upward turn for the Lady Patriots, as they grabbed an early lead, and led the rest of the way, in beating the Lady Mustangs, 50-39.

Trinity Barkley poured in 16 points, Kaitlyn Carpenter canned 13 more, and Madison Brown followed with another nine, as Powdersville completed a two-game regular season sweep of Palmetto.

"We had made making the playoffs as our norm, and we're so happy to have accomplished that goal again this season," Coach Prescott commented, "We're looking forward to playing Pendleton."

The Lady Patriots went into Monday's playoff opener with an overall record of 12-8.

Powdersville's boys fell short of making the post-season field after losing their last five region games, including Thursday's finale at Palmetto.

Coach Joey Tollison's guys struggled to regain their early-season offensive touch during that five-game skid, and their lack of a scoring punch cost them against the Mustangs, as they came out on the narrow end of the scoreboard, 55-49.

The Patriots showed promise of getting a win early-on, as they stayed within a couple of baskets of Palmetto for most of the evening, only to fall short in several attempts to overtake the equally-struggling Mustangs.

Josh Moore highlighted a spirited effort by the Patriots by scoring a game-best 18 points.

Qushawn Brown netted 10 points, Ben Rust had eight, and Grayson Davis got seven more for the Patriots, who finished the season at 8-13 overall an 2-8 in Region II-AAA.

3-A Playoffs

Wren Boys top seed; Girls in fourth place

Wren is the top-seeded team in the Upper-State 3-A Boys Basketball Playoffs after winning a special tiebreaker game against Greenville to claim the Region I-AAAA Championship.

The Running Canes open their postseason run this (Wednesday) evening at home against Region III fourth-place seed Richland Northeast.

With a win in that game, Wren would host either second-seed Travelers Rest or third-seed South Aiken on Saturday.

It, with another victory, would have the home-court advantage for a third-round match-up on Tuesday, and with a win in that game, would be considered the home team for the Upper-State 3-A Championship Finals.

Coach Fran Campbell's boys enter the playoffs with a wealth of momentum, having won 11 of their last 12 overall games, including three in four days during the past week.

They wrapped up their regular season region schedule by bashing B-HP, 75-39.

Trey McGowens scored 19 points, had seven assists, and made three steals, while Jeremiah Neubia netted 14 points and grabbed eight rebounds, as Cameron Willis tallied 14 points and snared seven rebounds.

Isaac Ford fired in 12 points, Owen Wilson scored nine and grabbed seven rebounds, and Brody Bruce added six points for Wren.

The Hurricanes celebrated 'Senior Night' by defeating non-region rival Eastside, 60-57.

Ford led the scoring with 19 points, McGowens had 15 points, eight rebounds, seven assists, and two steals, and John Kanaan added 12 points and 12 rebounds.

With Wren and Greenville both finishing the regular season at 7-1 in region play, they had to play a special tiebreaker game at Carolina High School to decide the outright champion.

That third and deciding meeting clearly belonged to the Hurricanes, as they blew

through the Red Raiders, 73-50.

Jeremiah Neubia gunned in 24 points and Trey McGowens was also firing away, getting 23, to lead the championship performance.

John Kanaan came through with 11 more and Isaac Ford added another 10, as Wren improved to 20-4 overall and retained its sixth-place ranking in State Class 4-A.

The Lady Hurricanes will have to do their state title bidding on the road, following a fourth-place finish in their region race.

They opened the playoffs with a Tuesday evening game at Ridge View, and with a win in that game, would go to Travelers Rest or Midland Valley on Friday.

Coach Pam McGowens saw her girls cap off their region season with a 53-50 victory over B-HP.

Bryanna Pickens tossed in 17 points and hauled down seven rebounds to lead that winning effort.

Wren's regular season ended in a 54-27 loss to Eastside, with Hannah Funk scoring 14 points, snaring four rebounds, dishing out four assists, and making a steal to lead the 11-12 Lady Hurricanes.

Woodmont Basketball

Both teams compete in 5-A Playoffs new Woodmont Coach

Woodmont made great strides in its first season of basketball competition in the new Class 5-A, as both Wildcat teams qualified for the State 5-A Playoffs.

The Lady Wildcats earned their postseason invitation with a runner-up finish in Region I-AAAAA, and opened the playoffs at home against Greenwood on Tuesday.

A victory in that game would have brought fourth-seeded Boiling Springs to Woodmont or sent our second-seeded local girls to top-seeded Rock Hill this Friday.

The Wildcat girls closed out their regular season schedule with convincing wins over Easley and J.L. Mann to finish in a tie with T.L. Hanna

for the top spot in the final region standings.

That deadlock forced a tie-breaker game between the two co-leaders, with T.L. Hanna prevailing to earn the region championship and top seed in the Upper-State.

Against Easley, the Lady Wildcats got a total team effort to win, 67-23.

Laimani Simmons rattled the rim for 23 points and also grabbed six rebounds to lead the way for Woodmont.

JaRae Smith had 13 points, five steals, and four assists, while Xan Roland added 11 more points to the final score.

Kitara Henry nabbed seven rebounds, Sydney Wyatt hauled down six more, and Azriela Folkes snared another

five.

In their 78-26 romp past J.L. Mann, the Lady Wildcats got 21 points, 11 rebounds, four assists, and four steals from Simmons.

Roland gunned in 18 points, Folkes tallied 11 and snatched 10 rebounds, and Henry added 10 points and 10 rebounds.

LaChara Logan pulled in seven rebounds and Sham Williams added five more.

Turnovers doomed Woodmont in the tiebreaker game, as T.L. Hanna took advantage of 26 miscues by the Lady Wildcats to get the win, 61-41.

Simmons was once again the top scorer for Woodmont, nailing 16 points while Smith was right behind her with 15.

Wyatt led the rebounding effort with seven grabs., as the Lady Wildcats slipped to 17-8.

The Wildcat guys punched their postseason ticket with a fourth-place showing in region play.

They are set to open the playoffs this (Wednesday) evening at top-seeded Wade Hampton.

An upset victory in that game would send the fourth-seeded Wildcats to either Gaffney or Nation Ford on Saturday.

The local boys finished the regular season at 7-15 after losing last week's games at Easley, 72-66, and J.L. Mann, 61-54.

"Jet" Turner has rebuilt struggling football programs at three different high schools during his 20-year career as a head coach.

And now, he's going to try to do the same thing at Woodmont High School.

Turner has been hired as the 12th varsity head coach in the school's 51-year history, and he comes in boasting a proven track record.

The Coastal Carolina University graduate got his first head coaching job at Ware Shoals, which, at the time of his hiring, was riding the longest losing streak in the entire state.

His first three teams each finished 2-8, then the turnaround took hold the fourth season, when the Hornets went 8-4.

The following year, Ware Shoals posted a 12-2 overall record and advanced to the Upper-State Championship Finals.

Coach Turner led the Hornets to a 7-5 showing the next season, then left to take over a Clover program that had also seen better times in years past.

His first season, in 2003, was also his only one in eight overall years with the Blue Eagles that ended with a losing record, as Clover finished 5-6.

The Blue Eagles continued to make greater strides, going 6-5, 9-4, and 11-2 before posting a 13-2 overall record and winning the State 4-A Division II Championship in 2007.

Coach Turner remained at

Clover for three more seasons, leading his teams to records of 9-4, 8-4, and 9-3, before taking over at Wilson Hall, a private school in Sumter.

He was with the Barons for just one season, with that 2011 campaign ending with a final record of 13-1.

His next stop was to Spartanburg County's Broome High School, which was coming off a 1-10 season.

The Centurions showed remarkable progress right away, going 5-6 in Coach Turner's first season, followed by a 9-3 showing that included winning the region championship.

His next three teams were 7-4, 4-6, and 6-4, with last year's squad posting an eye-catching victory over the nationally-acclaimed Byrnes Rebels.

All-in-all, Coach Turner has enjoyed 14 winning seasons in his 20 years as a head coach, while posting an overall record of 147-88.

He is now excited and "ready to get to work" at Woodmont, calling it "a gold mine" opportunity.

"We (Broome) scrimmaged them last year, and I was really impressed with the number of kids they had, and the support they've got." He recalled, "They want to build a program that you can be proud of, and their line of thinking is right with mine."

"I think it's a good match, and I think everything's in place." He contends, "You've got to get in there and get those kids believing. I'm just thrilled to be given this opportunity, and I'm ready to get to work."

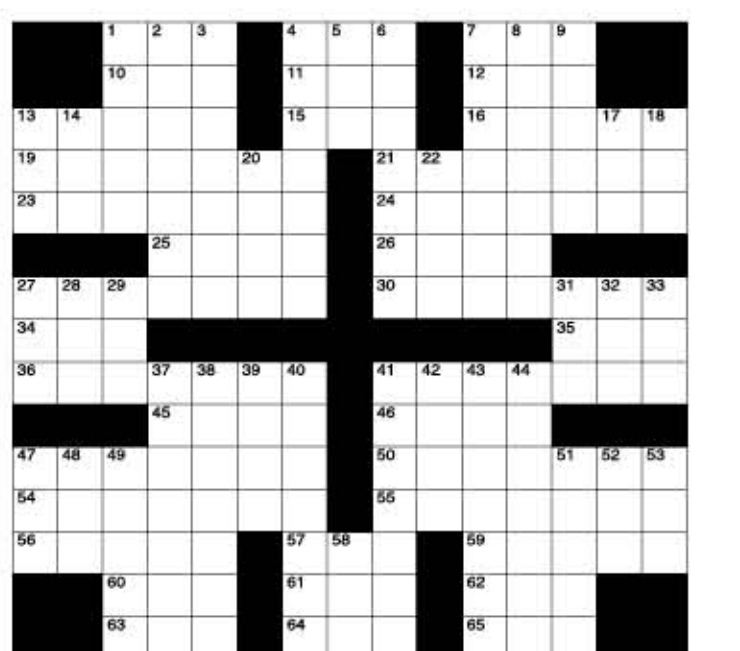

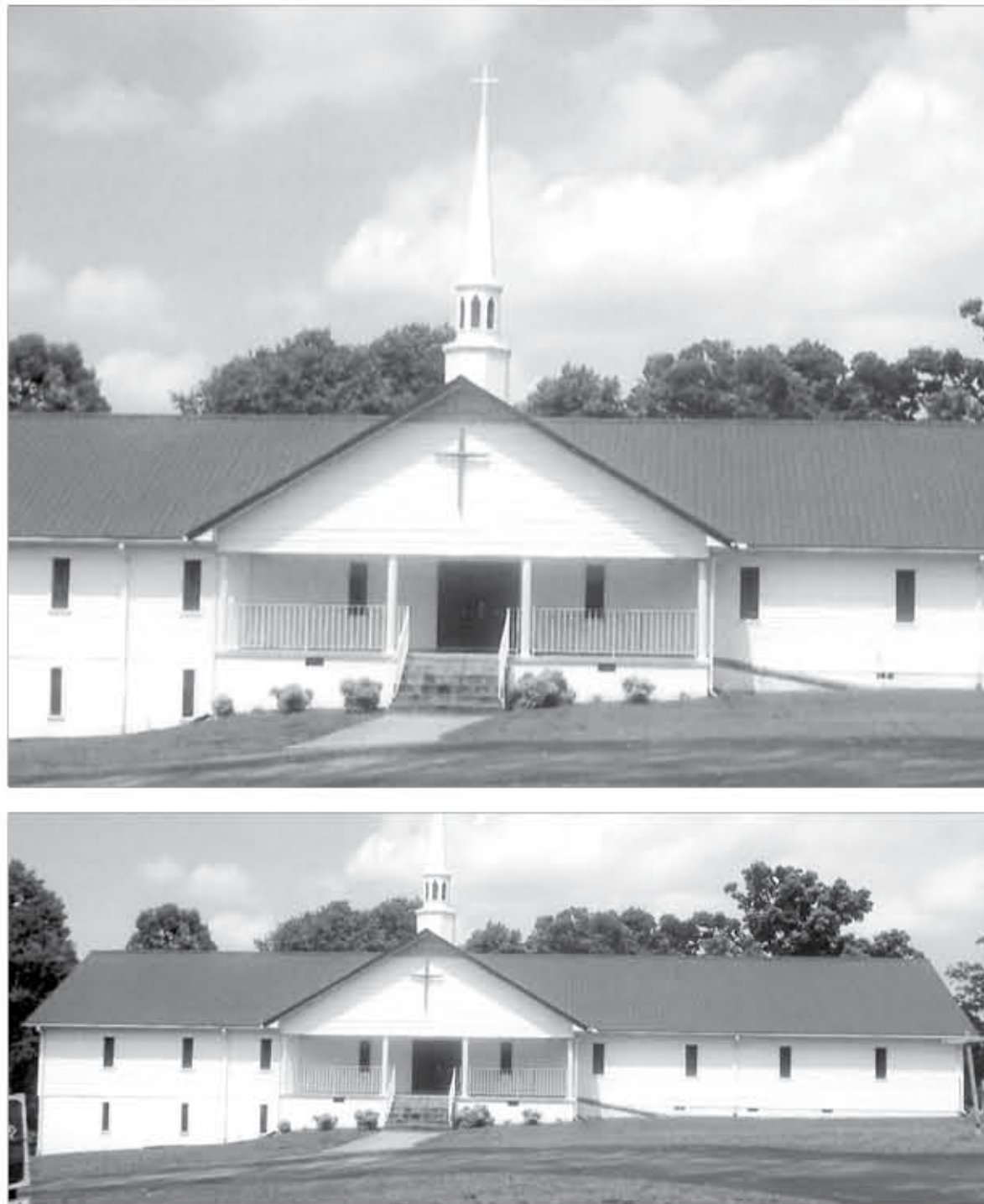
